Treasurer Report – Tora Cameron

- The total available operating funds are \$1,164.64, with a bank balance of \$12,150.62.
- The total available gaming funds are \$4,795.48, with a bank balance of \$15,478.08.
- The funding requests for rugby balls (\$255) and tournament fees (\$350) have been approved. It was decided to deny the bus fee application to keep it similar to the swim meet application.
- The funding requests for 'Daz Girlz' yoga mats (\$409.50) was approved.
- The funding requests for Disk Golf was also approved.
- The funding request for the hokki chairs was denied at this time, seeing as PAC has already purchased 10 stools this year. PAC would be open to looking at an application again next year from Julie Proulx' brother, if the school approves the use of these stools.
