## ANNUAL REPORTS:

## Treasurer - Tora Cameron

Reviewed budget (attached).

Due to the profitability of the 4 PAC Hot Lunches there was discussion on the feasibility of doing more next year. This would of course be dependent on Bridget Anderson who has stepped into the coordinator role for next year. Wendy MacDonald added some thoughts as well as history regarding the weekly pizza lunches and the canteen. The pizza lunches were initially part of PAC, however the canteen ended up running a large deficit and was suddenly left in this state due to the unfortunate passing of the individual who ran it. Pizza lunch became part of the school in order to service the debt, which is essentially paid off now. There is a desire to have the canteen back up and running one day as it is a large piece to middle school that is currently missing. There has been discussion with Staff on where to go with pizza lunch and how Staff and the PAC can collaborate to do this fundraiser. There are areas in the school such as the P.E. Dept, Learning Commons and Home Economics that will likely need funds to upgrade in this next year. The Canteen is currently being used for Forgotten Lunch as well as other small food projects. Wendy expressed that she is open for further discussion on more lunches, however feels like there is a good balance right now in the school and encourages everyone to be mindful of adding more so that it doesn't take away from what we are already doing.

## Communications - Natalie Salem

Communications felt somewhat 'slow' compared to last year for various reasons: one being due to not producing the newsletters that were done in previous years; another being due to hot lunch/fundraising posters being updated and reused from last year instead of creating new this year. Natalie really enjoyed the partnership with Marti in this role and if there is room for her to continue next year in this role she would be happy to. Will look to add in the newsletter and taking on the Bayside PAC gmail if continuing in the role.

## Fundraising - Marti Redman (not officially in this role, but assisted throughout the year)

- Spirit-wear has been a success. Sold 75 hoodies at the recent Grade 5 Parent event as well as zip hoddies and 8 t-shirts (of which there was none in stock in their size). Orders will be completed this evening and submitted tomorrow with the intention to have the clothing back for distribution June $21^{\text {st }}$. Of note, the spring Spirit Wear fundraiser was much better than fall.
- Monk School Supplies was another great fundraiser for the 2017-18 year. Some issues last year in getting the orders fulfilled, but Monks has assured Marit this won't be an issue again. Online ordering is to open June 1 and we get $10 \%$ sales from Bayside orders. Mostly Grade 6 families seem to take advantage of it this fundraiser but there are families in Grade 7/8 that do as well.
- Grade 5 night was successful. Lots of people, great information.
- 4 Great PAC lunches. Great way to connect with the kids

In speaking out to the new attendees at the meeting, Marti acknowledge that while money/fundraising is one portion of PAC, the commitment, passion and community involvement is what it is about.

- Marti recommended building a vision for next years PAC at the final PAC meeting in June. Encouraged the new attendees and 2018-19 PAC to attend that meeting, even if they do not have a child in the school this year.
