EXAMPLES: Ellen Kennan, Uncle John, First Street, Spain, Yukon, Laurentian Mountains, New Year's Day, March, Niles High School, *Sea Voyager*
- **Capitalize** the first word of a quotation.
EXAMPLE: Tonya said, "Everyone should learn a poem."
- **Capitalize** the first, last, and all important words in the titles of books, poems, stories, and songs.
EXAMPLES: "Happy Birthday to You"; *The Dog Who Wouldn't Be*
- **Capitalize** all proper adjectives. A proper adjective is an adjective that is made from a proper noun.
EXAMPLES: the French language, German food, American tourists
