- You can order online and still pay with cash or cheque .

## Bayside's Outdoor Classroom & Peace Garden

### Bayside Middle School was selected for Canada 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary grant!



**Our school was awarded \$15,300 for an outdoor classroom and peace & friendship garden!**

The PAC is thrilled that Bayside was awarded \$15,300 from TD Friends of the Environment Foundation under its Common Ground Project in celebration of Canada's 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. We were one of only two schools chosen to receive this special funding on Vancouver Island. Our project is entitled *NEPENEKÁUTW Outdoor Classroom and Saanich Moons Peace Garden: Land-based Learning for Environmental Stewardship and Intercultural Friendship*.



NEPENEKÁUTW means "Place of Teaching" in SENĆOŦEN and it is the name that we have selected for this new space, which will promote the values of our school and provide culturally relevant learning opportunities to all the students at Bayside. This project is an important way for Bayside to enhance indigenous education, such as the Saanich Moons curriculum, to implement the recommendations of the Canadian Truth and Reconciliation Commission, and to mark the Year of Reconciliation with our First Nation communities.



Our outdoor classroom is now almost built and it is beautiful! It will have benches on three sides to accommodate one class of students. We are very grateful for the generous in-kind donations from Bradley Shuya Architect Inc for the design, Butler Brothers for the concrete, Flynn Canada for the roof, Peninsula Rock Products for the gravel, Mike Watson Trucking for excavation and Unitech for the construction oversight. We greatly appreciate the discounts that we received from Ryzuk Geotechnical and City Pump.



We commissioned local indigenous artist, Charles Elliot, to create an art piece based on the Saanich Moons curriculum that will be mounted on the front gable of the outdoor classroom. Bayside Principal Wendy MacDonald and District Vice-Principal for Indigenous Education Melissa Austin recently went to Elliot's studio to see his impressive carving in progress. In the new school year 2017-2018, we plan to integrate student-created art in the new outdoor classroom and garden.

Garden designer Sandra Bunting of Island Horticultural Services is donating her expertise to help create the peace and friendship gardens that will surround the outdoor classroom. Sandra has a child attending Bayside and we are so happy to have parent involvement in our project! Grade 7 teacher Julie Proulx will also assist in the garden design. We appreciate the Indigenous education perspectives of teacher Ivy Seward and assistant Megan Supernault. The garden will incorporate log and rock seating, paths and native plants. The excavation of the garden will be done over the summer. In early September when school is back in session, students will have an opportunity to help with the planting.

In our new gardens, we are also installing a cedar peace pole. The pole just arrived and is waiting in the principal's office. On the pole, the text "May Peace Prevail on Earth" is inscribed in twelve different languages representing the most common languages of our school including English, French and SENĆOŦEN. The message "May Peace Prevail on Earth" started by Masahisa Goi in Japan in 1955. Goi was deeply affected by the destruction caused by World War II and the atomic bombing of the Japanese cities of Hiroshima and Nagasaki and committed his life to promoting his message for world peace. Goi's message then began appearing on poles around the world. The Peace Pole Project was formally started in North America in 1986, the United Nations' International Year of Peace. Peace poles are now the most recognized peace monument with more than 200,000 poles standing in almost every country throughout the world. Bayside Middle School will be the first school on the peninsula with a peace pole!

Our outdoor classroom and peace and friendship garden will be officially unveiled in the evening of Thursday, September 21, which is the UN International Day of Peace. The Bayside event will also be the PAC welcome back BBQ and open house. We will invite local politicians and the media. We warmly welcome our Bayside Middle School community to this unveiling and celebration.

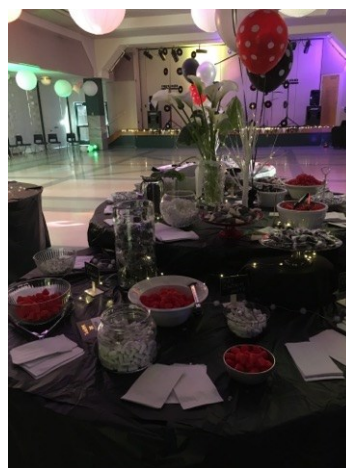
## Farwell Grade 8's

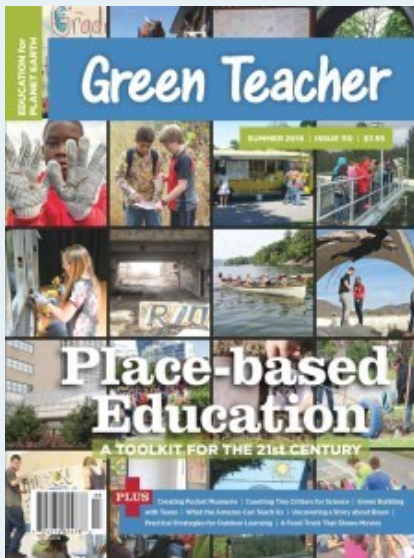

## Report Cards & Early Dismissal

Thursday, June 29th is the final day for students at Bayside Middle School. The most important function of the day is to distribute report cards. If you wish to have your child’s report card mailed to you, please be sure to provide your child’s teacher with a self-addressed, stamped (\$1.34) envelope [9” X 12”], otherwise report cards will remain in the office for you to pick up in early July or late August.

Report cards and class activities will be finished by 10:00 am. The rest of the day, the students will be involved in classroom and school preparation/clean-up work. In the past, we have had a great number of students bring notes to be dismissed early on this day. **If you wish your child to be dismissed at approximately 10:00 am on June 29th, please complete and return the Early Dismissal form to your child’s homeroom teacher.** Please note: students who have permission to leave at 10:00 MUST leave the school grounds at that time.

**NOTE: Buses will NOT be available at 10:00—school buses will run at their regularly scheduled times in the afternoon. Written permission is necessary in order to dismiss your young person early — phone calls or faxes WILL NOT be accepted as we don't know who has called or sent the fax and the safety of your child is paramount.**
